Best Practice 1: Exceptional Performance by NCC cadets including their participation in Republic Day Parade.

Goal: The NCC aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. Further, it aims at creating a pool of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose. Needless to say, the NCC also provides an environment conducive to motivating young Indians to join the armed forces.

Context: The NCC is a responsive, learning and continuously evolving organization. Its activity is guided by certain core values that we endeavour to instill among all ranks of the NCC. These include the following:

- The cadets should aware and develop the patriotic commitment to encourage cadets to contribute to national development.
- Respect for diversities in religion, language, culture, ethnicity, life style and habitat to instill a sense of National unity and social cohesion.
- The cadets should be available for community development programme and other social programme.

The Practice: The College has an NCC (Naval Wing) division with cadet strength of 54 cadets. The division is under the command of 49 Assam Naval Unit of Dibrugarh Group Head Quarter of North Eastern Region (NER) directorates. Mrs. Junti Pator is CTO of the institution who looks after the division. The cadets enrolled under the division has been regularly attending the different camps conducted in National and Regional level where they are taught about different water born activities like Boat Pulling, Sailing, Semaphore, Riffle drill, Foot drill etc. A large number of NCC cadets of our college appear in "B" and "C" certificates examination every year. "B" and "C" certificate examinations have been organizing by 49 Assam Naval Unit, Sibsagar under the control of three NCC Group Head quarters.

Throughout the year NCC cadets engage in various social and community development activities.



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Major practices of NCC are “ Swachh Bharat Abhiyan’’, Cleanliness drive, tree plantation, blood donation, international yoga day celebration, observation of Martyrs’ Day, participation in Independence Day parade, Republic Day.

Evidence: Overall development, communication skill, self-discipline, honesty, punctuality etc. characters were observed in participated NCC cadets. Most of the cadets' get motivated for Army services. Cadets are enthusiastically involved in community and social services. Leadership qualities observed in cadets. Most of the NCC Cadets actively participate in various college activities and acting as a grooming leader.
